What Went Wrong with Wright?

Robert Silman will talk about repairs to four Frank Lloyd Wright buildings that his firm, Robert Silman Associates (RSA), has undertaken. These are: Fallingwater, Bear Run, PA, Wingspread, Racine, WI, Darwin D. Martin House, Buffalo, NY, and Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, New York, NY. Mr. Silman will present the structural problems in these unique buildings and then demonstrate how repairs were made, within the historic context of these great works of architecture. Using modern technologies, not available to Frank Lloyd Wright, RSA has successfully solved the problems created when Mr. Wright "pushed the envelope."
